

Sub-cut Instructions (optional)

It's perfectly fine to sew directly off the strip and trim as you go, if you want to do that, please ignore this section. However, if you prefer to pre-cut the strips into sub-units before you start sewing, here are the sub-cut instructions. There will be some leftover fabric.

As you cut, separate the fabric into 4 stacks (A, B, C, D)

From the **4" sky strip**, cut:

- One 6.5" piece for Stack A
- Two 3.5" pieces for Stack B
- Two 3" pieces for Stack A

From the **2.5" sky strip**, cut:

- Two 8" pieces for Stack D
- One 6" piece for Stack B
- One 4" piece for Stack C
- Two 4" pieces for Stack D

From the **4" house strip**, cut:

- One 10" piece for Stack B
- One 5" piece for Stack B
- One 5" piece for Stack C

From the **2.5" house strips**, cut [you will use the both 2.5" strips]:

- Two 8" pieces for Stack D
- Three 4" pieces for Stack D
- One 5" piece for Stack C
- Two 4" pieces for Stack C
- Two 4" piece for Stack A

Now you should have 4 stacks of fabric. Each one corresponds to a template section.

Section A (the chimneys) -

- Piece A1 uses a 4" x 6.5" rectangle of sky fabric
- Pieces A2 & A4 use 2.5" x 4" rectangles of house fabric
- Pieces A3 & A5 use 4" x 3" rectangles of sky fabric

Section B (the roof) -

- Piece B1 uses a 4" x 10" rectangle of house fabric
- Pieces B2 & B5 use 4" x 3.5" rectangles of sky fabric
- Piece B3 uses a 2.5" x 6" rectangle of sky fabric
- Piece B4 uses a 4" x 5" rectangle of house fabric

Section C (the front of the house) -

- Pieces C1 & C3 use 2.5" x 4" rectangles of house fabric
- Piece C2 uses a 2.5" x 4" rectangle of sky fabric
- Piece C4 uses a 4" x 5" rectangle of house fabric
- Piece C5 uses a 2.5" x 5" rectangle of house fabric

Section D (the side of the house) -

- Pieces D1, D3 & D5 use 2.5" x 4" rectangles of house fabric
- Pieces D2 & D4 use 2.5" x 4" rectangles of sky fabric
- Pieces D6 & D8 use 2.5" x 8" rectangles of house fabric
- Pieces D7 & D9 use 2.5" x 8" rectangles of sky fabric
