## Card Trick

from Quilting Daily

Welcome Fall, let's make this month's block in warm fall hues. We'll make the background off white like the block shown above. Completed blocks will be made into a benefit quilt. The unfinished block will be approx. $81 / 2$ inches. Please use $100 \%$ cotton, good quality fabric. All seams are $1 / 4$ inch.

## Instructions:

You will need:
Background
Piece A - Cut two squares 4 7/8" $\times 4$ 7/8"; sub cut diagonally to make a total of 4 half-square triangles


Piece B - Cut one square $51 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$; sub cut diagonally to make 4 quarter-square triangles

From each of FOUR different prints (orange, red, brown, yellow or green), cut the following:

Piece A - 1 square $47 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 47 / 8^{\prime \prime}$; sub cut diagonally to make 2 half-square triangles
Piece B - Cut one square $51 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$; sub cut diagonally twice to make 4 quartersquare triangles (Note: 2 triangles will be leftover for each print)

Piecing the block:
Step 1. Sub Unit A. Using Diagram I as a guide, sew background fabric, Piece A to one each of the print fabric, Piece A. Make 1 pieced-square unit for each fabric combination.


Step 2. Sub Unit B. Sew background quarter-square triangles (Piece B) to one each of the four print fabrics. Sew Piece A prints to each quarter-square units, using Diagram II as a fabric combination guide.


Make 1 of each fabric combination
Step 3. Sub Unit C. Referring to Diagram III for fabric combination, sew print fabric quarter-square triangles (Piece $B$ ) together to make square.


Assembling the Block
Step 4. Using Assembly Diagram as a guide, piece sub units together to make rows. Piece rows together to make Card Trick block.
