

Rising Star Quilt Guild Mystery Quilt 2020 - 21

Clue #3

This month we will make sets of flying geese for Block 2. We will also cut the remaining pieces and use **some** of them.

Flying Geese

For the small quilt you will need **4 sets of 4 = 16** Rec: 7 sets of 4 = 28; LG: 12 sets of 4 = 48

Feel free to use whatever method you prefer including the no waste method, as described last month. **Finished size – 2 ½" X 4 ½"** (which includes the ¼" seam)

You will use the same fabrics but the **colors will be opposite** from last month.

For each **set of 4**, using the no waste method, cut:

1 - 5 ¼" square of Fabric A

4 – 2 7/8" squares of Fabric B

Cut 2 ½" squares

Using fabrics C and D cut 2 ½" squares. You will need 2 squares from each fabric per block

For the small quilt you will need **18 - 2½" squares of each fabric** Rec: 30 of each fabric; LG: 50 of each fabric

Scrappy alternative: Use a variety of fabrics that go with fabric A and B. These squares will ultimately form a 4-patch.

Adding squares to Flying Geese

Using **half** of the number of flying geese you have made today (**8**; Rec. 14; LG 24) you will add one square of fabric C and one square of fabric D to each end. Your finished pieces will be 2 ½" X 8 ½".

IMPORTANT: Line up your Flying Geese so they are all facing the same direction, point up. Sew fabric C squares to the left end of Flying Geese blocks. Then sew fabric D to the right end. They should all look the same! (Even if you are making a scrappy version your C scraps will be on the left and your D scraps will be on the right).

Place your **8** (14; 24) strips and **8** (14, 24) remaining flying geese together with your **4** (7; 12) squares from Clue #1 in your Block 2 bag/box. The remaining 2 ½ " squares can be added to your Block 1 bag/box.
